

Pavilion Parties continue on the fourth Saturday of each month at 1 pm at the home of Bill Van Druten, 2931 Greysolon Road.


Please remember that we can park anywhere on Greysolon Road, but NOT on 30th Avenue

### Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom Enacted 1786



n January 16th 1786, Thomas Jefferson's Statute for Religious Freedom passed the Virginia General Assembly. The preamble to its three paragraphs is a sweeping indictment of state-dictated religion, noting that "false religions over the greatest part of the world and through all time" have been maintained through the church-state alliance: "To compell a man to furnish contributions of money for the propagation of opinions which he disbelieves is sinful and tyrannical. ... Our civil rights have no dependence on our religious opinions, any more than our opinions in physics or geometry."

The heart of the statute has been replicated in differing versions in most state constitutions. So important was the statute to Jefferson that he gave these instructions for the epitaph to be placed on his tombstone: "Thomas Jefferson/Author of the Declaration of American Independence, of the Statute of Virginia for Religious Freedom & Father of the University of Virginia." Omitting his two terms as president, Jefferson wrote these were the "testimonials that I have lived and by which I wish most to be remembered."

"That no man shall be compelled to frequent or support any religious worship, place, or ministry whatsoever, nor shall be enforced, restrained, molested, or burthened in his body or goods, nor shall otherwise suffer, on account of his religious opinions or belief: but that all men shall be free to profess, and by argument to maintain, their opinions in matters of religion, and that the same shall in no wise diminish, enlarge, or affect their civil capacities."
